



1,600 Attend Services

Baccalaureate services were held in Savannah yesterday for more than 1,600 seniors graduating from Savannah, Groves, Jenkins, Country Day, Tompkins, Beach and Johnson High Schools and Savannah State College.

The Rev. Tom Watson, pastor of Robert McIntire Methodist Church, in his sermon to members of the Savannah, Groves and Jenkins High School graduating classes asked two things of the students during services for the combined schools in Grayson Stadium.

'Tomorrow Yours'

Describing conformity as one of the ills of our day, he told the students "tomorrow belongs to you. The destiny of the human race is in your hands. We ask you to carry on our highest ideals and noblest aspirations and to correct the mistakes of your fathers' generation."

The Rev. Thomas L. Hastings, pastor of Christ Episcopal Church and president of the Savannah Protestant Ministerial Assn. which sponsored the services, welcomed the students.

Other speakers were the Rev. Joseph L. Griffin, pastor of St. Paul's Lutheran Church and the Rev. John Clark, pastor of Pooler Baptist Church. The Rev. Manford H. Saunders of Independent Presbyterian Church delivered the invocation.

Commencement exercises for Savannah High will be held in the same stadium at 8 p.m. Tuesday, for Groves High at 8 p.m. Wednesday in the Municipal Auditorium and for Jenkins High at 5 p.m. Wednesday in the new Memorial Stadium.
